LOCAL HEALTH DEPARTMENTS (LHDs) SPEND A LOT OF TIME PROVIDING IMMUNIZATIONS



32% MORE LHDs spent 20+ hours/week on related services (2017–2023)




61% OF STAFF TIME was dedicated to vaccine administration in 2023




PERCENT OF LHDs WITH HIGH CAPACITY FOR COMMUNICATING ABOUT IMMUNIZATION




PERCENT OF LHDs PRIORITIZING EACH ISSUE FOR THE NEXT THREE YEARS
