# Demonstration Site Objectives

- Funding to be used to support climate change and health adaptation initiatives at local organizations.
- Program will additionally provide technical assistance to facilitate successful implementation of climate and health initiatives.



# Eligibility to Apply

Applicants should:

- Be a local government entity or other local organization (e.g., community-based organization) working in climate change and health, or a state, tribal, or territorial government entity proposing a local project with a letter of support from the local government entity. “Local” is here defined as organizations working at county, city, or community levels (e.g., local health department);
- Have experience working on local climate change and health initiatives; and
- Demonstrate the need for funding.

# Step 1: Log In

# Step 2: Start Your Application

Your local health authority may be a health commissioner, a departmental director of environmental health, or another representative with appropriate decision-making authority. # Budgets

- Proposed budgets should not exceed \$25,000
- Funding...
  - **Cannot** be used for the purchase or upkeep of office furniture or equipment.
  - **Cannot** be used for research or clinical care
  - **Can** be used for program purposes, such as personnel, travel, supplies, and services
- Previous participants have sought reimbursement for staff training, field supplies, staff time, and consultants.

# Things to Note & Important Dates

- Address every section of the application
- Be concise, but thorough
- Letters of support are required only for applicants that are not an employee of a local health department
- **Applications are due by 11:59 pm ET on October 24, 2021**
  - Applications that are incomplete and/or submitted late will not be considered
- **Applicants will be notified of their application status around November 12**

# Project Timeline

- The project will run from November 15, 2021 – June 30, 2022.
- Deadlines to submit reimbursements:
  - Invoice period 1: **February 15, 2022**
  - Invoice period 2: **May 15, 2022**
  - Invoice period 3: **July 15, 2022**



# Expected Activities & Deliverables

- Participate in at least three bimonthly check-in calls with NACCHO and CDC throughout the project period
- Submit reimbursement materials for each invoice period by the appropriate deadline
- Submit final deliverables by June 30, 2022:
  - Final report detailing process and deliverables
  - Draft of NACCHO's Stories from the Field sharing your work
  - Presentation slides with speaking notes to be used by NACCHO at future webinars and/or conferences; OR present about your work through a NACCHO webinar or national conference
