

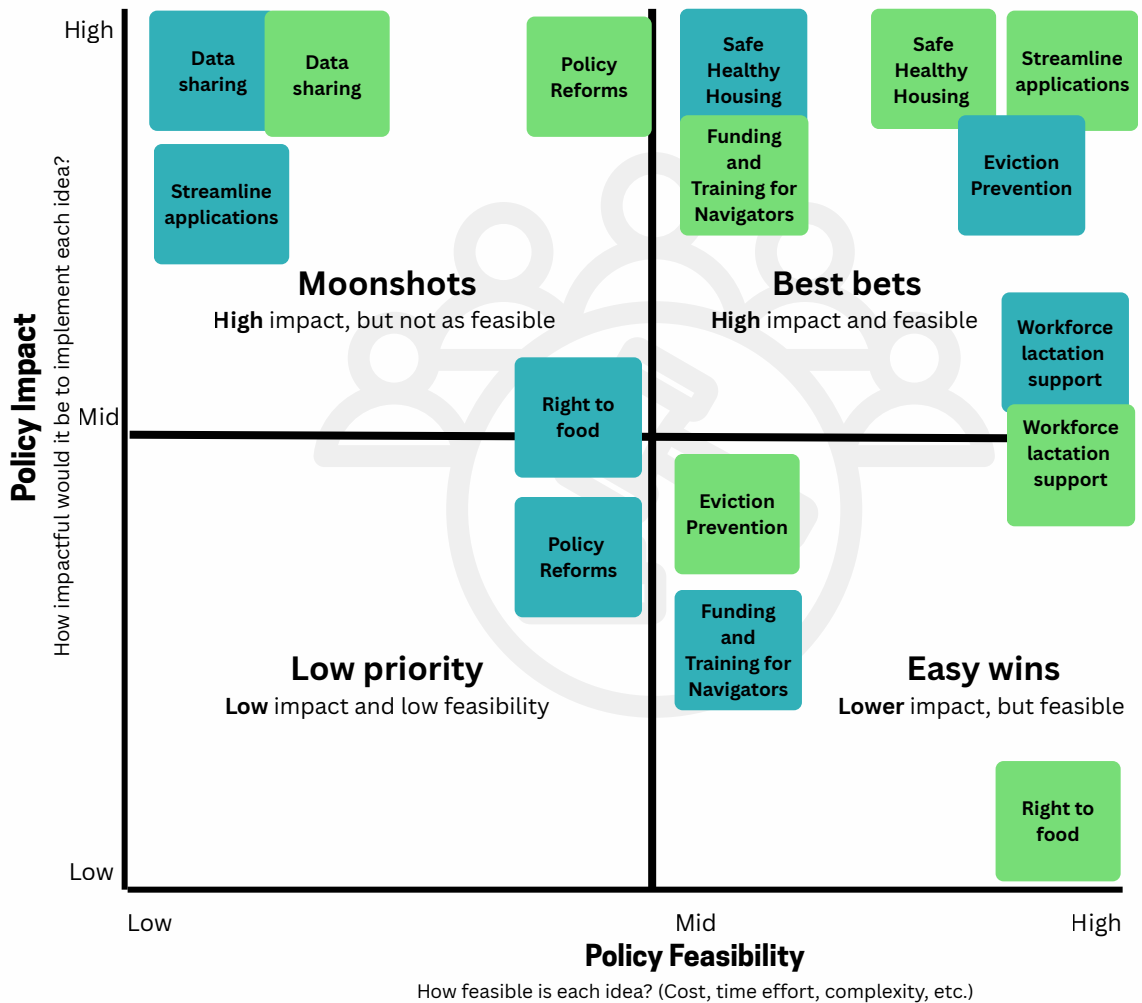
Completed Example:

Feasibility and Impact Matrix

A Subject Matter Expert Council was convened and identified Nutrition Security and Housing policy options (Left) and plotted them on the Feasibility and Impact Matrix (right)

Policy Options

- Ensure seamless **data sharing** across housing, nutrition, and health programs to improve coordination.
- Improve the accessibility of housing assistance resources and **streamline application** processes to minimize barriers.
- **Policy reforms** to review and revise eligibility restrictions for nutrition programs, including those related to past convictions.
- **Right to food**
- **Ensure safe and healthy housing** conditions, including clean carpets, mold-free environments, and lead abatement.
- **Fund navigators** and other support services to assist families.
- **Eviction prevention** measures for expectant families and families with infants and toddlers.
- **Worksite support** for lactating workers, students, and others

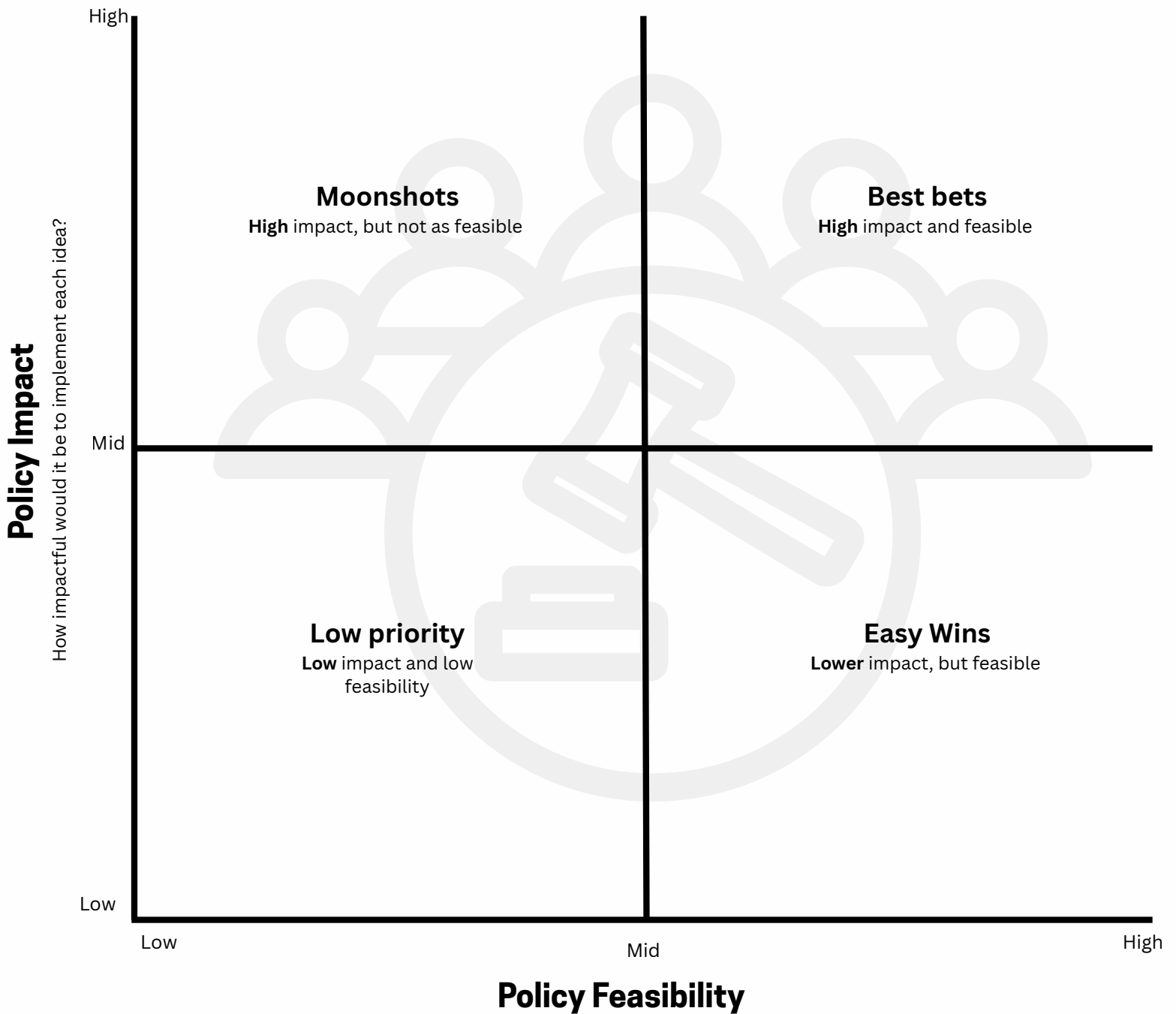
