

# THE IMPACT OF COVID-19 RESPONSE ON LOCAL HEALTH DEPARTMENT **IMMUNIZATION PROGRAMS**

In June 2020, NACCHO distributed a survey to 425 LHDs to assess the impact of COVID-19 response on local health department (LHD) capacity to conduct immunization (IZ) services. The survey received a 34% response rate. Results presented are reflective of a snapshot in time at the beginning of the pandemic.

#### **LHDs Redirect Resources to Respond to COVID-19**



88% reassigned IZ staff to focus on COVID response efforts



17% redirected IZ funding to support COVID response activities

#### LHD IZ Activities are Impacted by COVID-19 Response

**89%** indicated routine IZ activities have been impacted

## **Activities Most Impacted:**



Immunizations (83%)



Education, outreach, training, or partnership activities (68%)




Vaccines for Children (VFC) services (60%)



School assessments/audits (32%)
