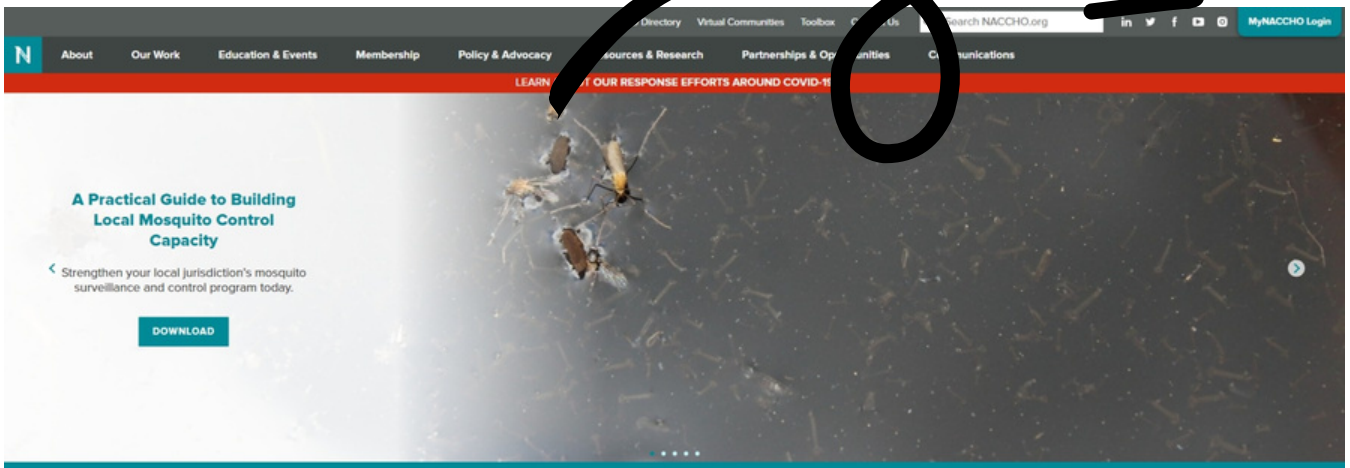


# Instructions: How to sign up for the HIV, STI, Viral Hepatitis, and Harm Reduction Digest

Visit [www.naccho.org](http://www.naccho.org) and click the “MyNACCHO Login” button at the top right corner of the main navigation menu. You will be directed to go offsite
