PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: This is the sixth webinar of the 8-part “Every Step of the Way through the 1,000 Days” series, on Relating to the Family Unit and their Social Determinants of Health in Chest/Breastfeeding support, that will focus on Recommendation 6 of the Continuity of Care in Breastfeeding Support: A Blueprint for Communities. This session will discuss relational continuity, cultural humility, family-centered lactation care, understanding the intersectionality of families, and how social determinants of health impact an infant’s feeding journey. Relational continuity, one of the dimensions of continuity of care, refers to the interpersonal aspect of the family unit and provider relationship, including the support and encouragement to the family unit through the development of trusting relationships between families and the professionals providing lactation support and other services.

OBJECTIVES:

At the conclusion of the session, the participant will be able to:

1. Discuss breastfeeding equity as a public health issue
2. Describe continuity of care gaps in community lactation support
3. Describe the role of multisectoral partnership in establishing continuity of care in breastfeeding support
4. Identify key recommendations and strategies to establish chest/breastfeeding CoC in the community
